You can see if you qualify for this by filling out your FAFSA. However, private schools don't have access to this right now, just public universities.
- **Concerns for Legislation:** There isn't a large budget to give money to all of the private schools on top of the public schools. However, we want to advocate that you should be able to go to any university, no matter your household income status.
